

If you have sustained an exposure to someone else's blood or body fluids:

- A. A splash to the face,
  - B. A spill, splash, or splatter to an open wound, or
  - C. A contaminated sharps injury that broke the skin
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- 1. Clean the affected area  
Face? Flush with lots of fresh water.  
Other area? Wash with soap and water.
  - 2. Report the exposure to your Safety Coordinator and Communities of care at 651-482-0549.
  - 3. Necessary follow-up will be provided by COC office staff.

You have the right to:

- 1. Have your blood collected and tested for HBV, HCV, and HIV at no cost to you.
- 2. Have your blood collected and preserved for at least 90 days while you decide whether or not you want it to be tested
- 3. Decline any medical treatment.
- 4. Counseling, at no cost to you.
